Department Chairs, Associate Deans, and Deans,

As you may have already seen, Provost Loboa sent a response to the Student Senate yesterday (included at the bottom of this email) indicating that the university is upholding its November decision not to extend the pass/fail option. As a function of the conversations that took place, two critical issues were identified. We need your help in addressing them right away:

- 1. There is a perception among many faculty and students that cheating has been more prevalent this fall because of the shift to online assessment due to the pandemic.
- 2. There are concerns about grading policies for final exams and final grades (in particular, students were concerned about classes that grade on a curve or that distribute grades on a curve). The concerns about cheating make this issue particularly salient.

We ask that each School/College follow up on how they will address these concerns as the final exam period is upon us. Each School/College should share back to the Provost Office how the concerns are being addressed in their areas so we can help communicate on your behalf when asked.

Please know that I would be happy to help by engaging in conversations to provide more context as you consider possible strategies, and a small number of ideas are also suggested below in the letter.
