As <u>announced yesterday</u>, SMU's Office of Global, Online and Continuing Education (GOCE) has now moved under the Moody School of Graduate and Advanced Studies. Under this new structure GOCE will hire professionals with terminal degrees to lead online graduate programs, stackable certificates, and noncredit pathways in high-demand areas for adult learners in the DFW area and beyond, all under the umbrella of the Moody School.
